A COMEDY/DRAMA FEATURE FILM. THE ARNOLD CHRONICLES (AKA "THE TRAVELS, OR "THE ARNOLD TRAVELS", IS A 1950'S PERIOD PIECE ABOUT TWO MARINE VETERANS WHO HAVE JUST RETURNED FROM THE KOREAN WAR, AND TRAVEL THROUGH THE CONTINENTAL SOUTH/SOUTHWEST IN SEARCH OF MEANING, ROMANCE AND ADVENTURE.

SYNOPSIS

The Arnold Chronicles (aka The Travels) is a 1955 period drama that follows two young Korean War veterans, Mexican-American Alfonso "Arnold" Villanueva and his friend, Charlie Johnson, as they drift through the American South and Southwest in search of meaning and adventure. In their military khakis, Arnold and Charlie journey across small towns in Mississippi, Louisiana, Texas, and New Mexico, haunted by their wartime trauma and feeling disconnected from a rapidly changing country. Set against a nostalgic 1950s backdrop of watermelon, lemonade, and cotton candy, the film explores hidden societal tensions of the era — hypocrisy, repressed sexuality, lust, racism, and spirituality. Their encounters with characters like Mr. Thompson, a closeted small-town figure who turns hostile after a failed seduction, and the beauty queens at the Neshoba County Fair, who reject Arnold due to his heritage, reveal the darker undercurrents of a seemingly idyllic America. As they travel west, a spiritual shift occurs in the New Mexico desert, where an Apache shaman leads them on a peyote journey, sparking deep reflection and insight. *The Arnold Chronicles* is a rich, allegorical tale of two free spirits facing the complexities and contradictions of a 1950s America in transition.



Alfonso "Arnold" Villanueve, 23 – A Mexican-American veteran, introspective and idealistic, haunted by wartime memories yet driven by a deep need for belonging and self-discovery.

Charlie Johnson, 28 – A carefree, charismatic Caucasian veteran, masking trauma with humor; his pursuit of thrill and pleasure often contrasts with Arnold's search for meaning.

Mr. Thompson, 50s – A respected small-town figure with a secret life; his hidden desires reveal themselves through manipulation, exposing the era's deep-seated hypocrisy and personal repression.

Miss Hattiesburg, early 20s – A poised Southern beauty pageant contestant, charming yet constrained by societal expectations; she captures Arnold's attention but is bound by the racial prejudices of her world.

Apache Shaman, **60s** – A wise, enigmatic figure who embodies spiritual depth; he guides Arnold and Charlie through a transformative peyote journey, offering insight and awakening in the vast New Mexican desert.

With its protagonists' quest for freedom and meaning, "The Arnold Chronicles" pays homage to Jack Kerouac's "On the Road" & "The Dharma Bums", Carlos Castaneda's "The Teachings of Don Juan," Geoffrey Chaucer's "The Canterbury Tales" and the movie "Easy Rider."
